Last week I had the privilege to co-present at the Inspire, Innovate 2016 Conference at ANZ Stadium with Miss Cooper, Miss Adams and Miss Chisholm. There were many educators from across the country who heard about the great work our school is doing by attending our workshop. So what did we share? Our presentation: "Collaborative, Reflective Learners need Collaborative Reflective Teachers - How opening our doors challenged our teaching, promoted collective efficacy and increased student autonomy."

Throughout this presentation we were able to share the great work our students have produced and strategies our teachers use to seek the best from their class. Perhaps your child can tell you what their WALT and WILF was for their lesson today, this something we shared. We also talked about our new flexible learning environments, project-based learning, the 6Cs and how our teachers work more collaboratively with their teams. As a result of this session we have many other schools who wish to visit Auburn West and see for themselves the great work that is taking place in all classrooms.

BE SAFE: UV WARNING

Every year over 12,500 people in Australia are diagnosed with an aggressive type of skin cancer called Melanoma. This disease can affect all ages and action must be taken now to prevent it from occurring.

UV (ultra violet) rays are invisible rays from the sun that are responsible for causing damage to our skin. Even on cloudy days these rays can still be extremely dangerous.

It is important for all parents to make sure they help protect their children by making sure they come to school with an AWPS school hat every day and it is strongly encouraged that they wear sunscreen to school everyday too. For the best protection sunscreen should be put on 20 minutes before leaving the house and then applied again just before coming to school so it can act as a protective layer.

Did you know that our skin could burn in less than 15 minutes of being outside?

Be sun safe aware! An AWPS hat and two coats of sunscreen will save your child's life.
